

Code of Conduct

Participation on a school study trip is a privilege and at all times students are representing (insert name of ISG school), as well as their families and home countries. All participants are expected to abide by the following general principles:

- The use of the following could require the participant to be collected by their parents IMMEDIATELY at parent's expense: drug use, alcohol use, smoking, stealing, use of weapons, physical fighting, insubordination, any criminal activity, and/or endangering the livelihood of themselves or others.
- The use of cellular phones and other devices are permitted ONLY at the discretion of the teacher/chaperone (some trips may not allow mobile phone use). Responsible and appropriate use is expected, if a student is not using their device responsibly or appropriately, the device will be confiscated. If the use of devices is permitted, the devices are the responsibility of the student at all times.
- Students are expected to stay with the group unless otherwise stated by a chaperone. Anyone unable to meet this expectation may lose privileges and /or be removed from the group by the chaperone.
- All participants are expected to follow school dress code on a trip, and be dressed conservatively for the airport. Appropriate/respectful attire is required at all times.
- Unacceptable behavior on a trip may prohibit participation in future trips.

Overnight trips:

- All participants are expected to be respectful and courteous during overseas travel and aware of the host country's cultural expectations. This includes behaving appropriately on airplanes and busses, in hotels, museums, restaurants, etc. and always being respectful.
- All participants will be responsible to pay for any bills they incur at the hotels, such as phone bills, snack bar items or breaking any item at the hotel.
